This shoot has been held for at least 15 years to my knowledge, and probably longer than that. Currently, the match consists of 25 metal silhouettes, 5 each of chickens, pigs, turkeys, rams, and bears, plus 4 metal silhouettes of buffaloes, at distances ranging from 25 yards to approximately 140 yards.

All firing (.22 LR rimfire only) is done from the standing position (no slings, kids shoot from any position), and score is determined by number of targets knocked down and, in the case of the buffaloes, how many shots hit the target. A perfect score is 30 and, yes, there have been a few perfect scores, but they are not regularly achieved. Good-natured chiding/harassment is encouraged, the idea is to have fun.

The shoot is held on the first Sunday of the month, from December to April. It is held outdoors and seldom is the shoot cancelled due to weather. Occasionally, the shoot will be suspended if the wind keeps blowing the targets down. So, \$5.00 will get you about all the fun you want on a cold winter day, come on out and try it!

First Sunday of the month - December through April - \$5.00 fee, kids shoot free, start time 9 am, 100-yard River Range.

Defensive Pistol

Do you have a concealed handgun permit? Do you plan on getting one? Or do you just like to shoot in a dynamic shooting sport with a lot of variety and challenges. If so, The La Grande Rifle and Pistol Clubs Defensive Pistol discipline might be for you. Join us on the 2nd Saturday of the month, from March to October, to test your skills in scenario-based shooting. It's easy! All you need is eye and ear protection, your handgun, 3 magazines, a strong side holster, magazine carriers and a concealment garment. Most matches require 100 to 150 rounds of ammo and the desire to have a good time.

We start setting up at 7:30am, all help is welcome, and start shooting by 9:30am. After the matches help with cleanup is encouraged, and we try to be done around 1:00-2:00 in the afternoon.
